EARLY DETECTION BLOODWORK

Did you know that 1 in 7 seemingly healthy adult pets have bloodwork abnormalities requiring further veterinary evaluation? Most household pets are considered adults by 12 months of age, so that means your pet should have bloodwork evaluated starting at their first annual exam. We feel so strongly about early detection leading to early treatment, that we have done everything we can to eliminate previously existing cost barriers. We now package baseline blood panels with routine testing like heartworm tests and fecal panels to allow you to test your pet without breaking the bank.
